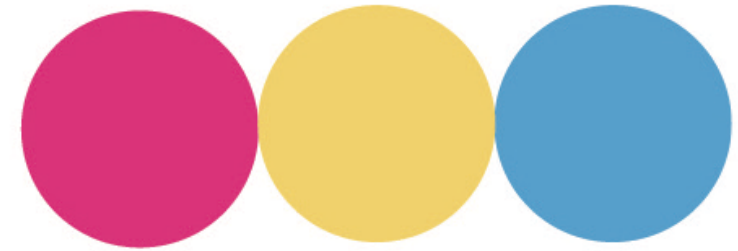

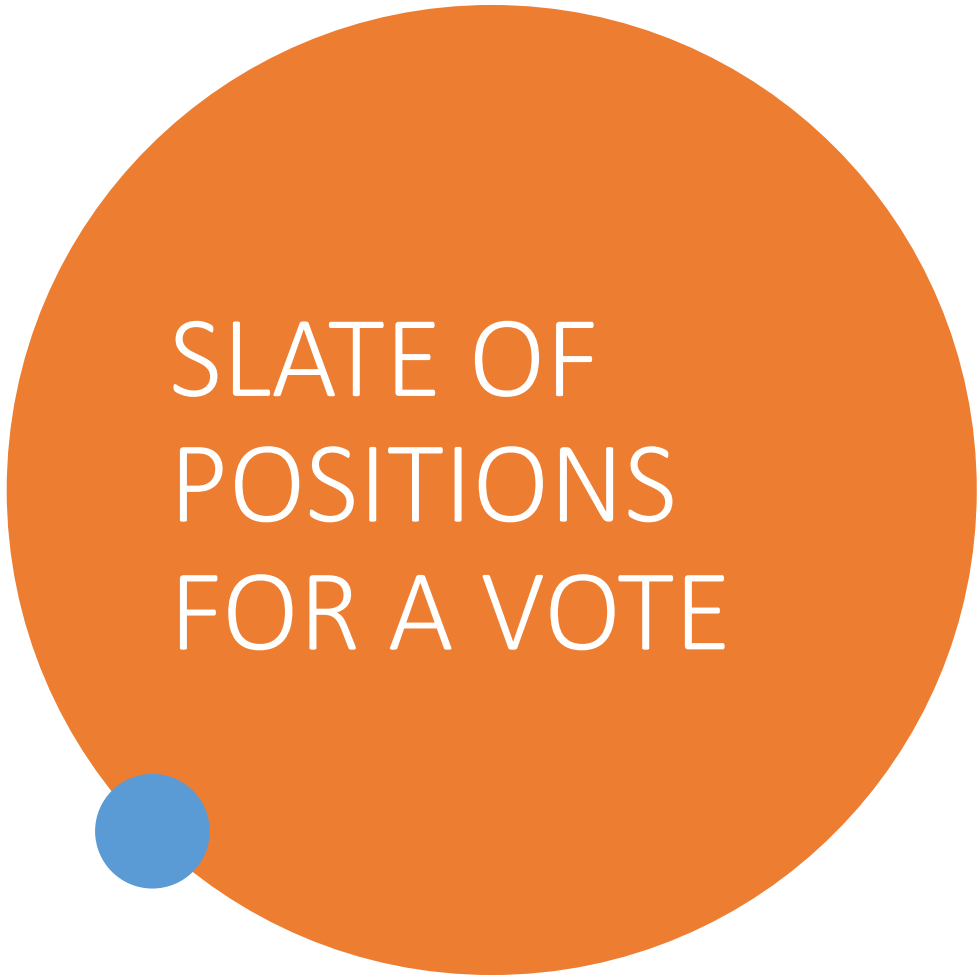




CALLING THE MEETING TO ORDER

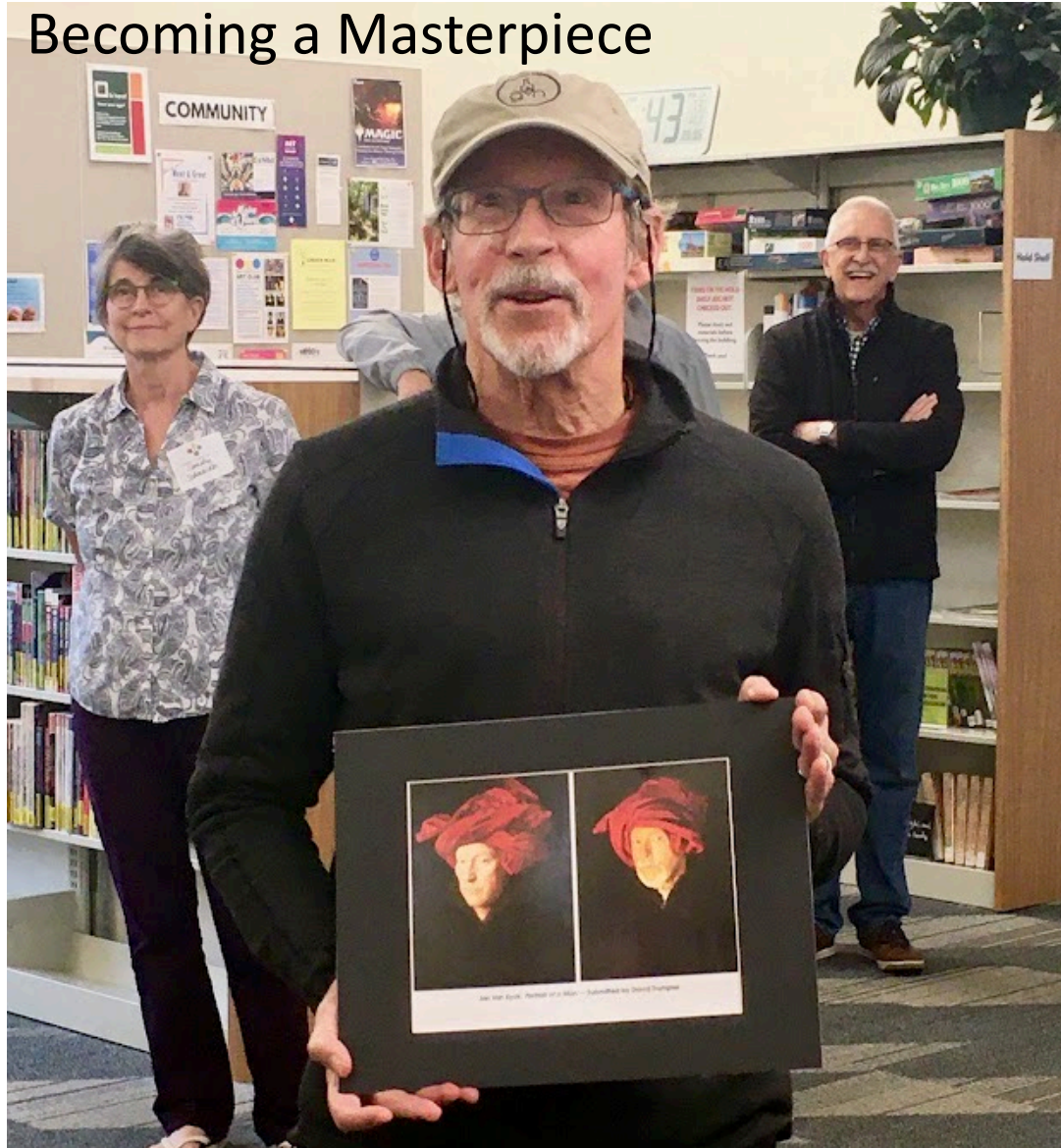
